Melbourne, Wednesday, 30 July 2014 – The Czech and Slovak Film Festival of Australia is delighted to announce that the 2014 **festival program** has been unleashed from the printers and is now hitting the streets of Melbourne, with Sydney to follow soon and with the full film and event schedule available now to view on the glorious <u>new CaSFFA website</u>.

This year's festival will be an all-round cultural treat focused on the **theme of** "resistance", inspired by the fact that **2014 marks the 25th anniversary of the** non-violent, extraordinarily effective "Velvet Revolution" in Czechoslovakia and the collapse of Communism in Europe.

Our wonderful new **festival trailer** encapsulates this year's theme of resistance, creating an exciting collage inspired by the films and artworks in this year's festival. We invite you to <u>enjoy the trailer right now on our YouTube channel</u>.

Just a few weeks ago, our Pozible crowd-funding campaign ended successfully, well over our initial target, with just under **\$12,000 raised**!

The entirely-volunteer run team fueling the production of the festival is over the moon with joy, but there is no time to lose! We are now working hard to **fulfil our promise of delivering an event that is even "bigger and better"** than our inaugural festival held in June last year.

The official program can already be collected in Melbourne from festival venues and various inner city cafes, eateries, galleries and community centres. **Tickets will be on sale in Melbourne from 3am on Thursday, 31 July**, and will shortly be available in Sydney too, via the new <u>CaSFFA website</u>, designed, like our program, by our wonderful partners, <u>Sense</u>.

Films illuminating the 2nd CaSFFA include:

- Opening Night in Melbourne, and Closing Night in Sydney: the superb To See the Sea (Pojedeme k moři, dir. Jiří Mádl, 2014)
- The paranoid historical thriller **The Confidant** (*eŠteBák,* dir. Juraj Nvota, 2012) will open the festival in Sydney
- HBO Europe mini-series **Burning Bush** (Hořící keř, dir. Agnieszka Holland, 2013)
- Digitally restored treasures from the past including *Closely Observed Trains* (*Ostře sledované vlaky*, dir. Jiří Menzel, 1966), *Birds, Orphans and Fools* (*Vtáčkovia, siroty a blázni*, dir. Juraj Jakubisko, 1969) and *Before Tonight is Over* (*Kým sa skončí táto noc*, dir. Peter Solan, 1966)
- Jan Švankmajer retrospective including *Alice* (Něco z Alenky, 1987) and *Conspirators of Pleasure* (Spiklenci slasti, 1996) and, in Melbourne, *Faust* (Lekce Faust, 1994) and *Little Otik* (Otesánek, 2000), co-presented with the Melbourne Cinémathèque
- **Delight** (*Rozkoš,* dir. Jitka Rudolfová, 2013), which competed at Karlovy Vary this year
- The controversial and gripping documentary **Normalization** (Kauza Cervanová, dir. Robert Kirchhoff, 2013), including a Q&A with the director after the Sydney screening
- A selection of new Czech and Slovak shorts, with a short preceding feature films throughout the festival
- **Closing the festival** in Melbourne will be the political comedy-thriller **Candidate** (Kandidát, dir. Jonáš Karásek, 2013)

The festival will bring you some extraordinary art, photographic and sculpture exhibitions which tie in both with the Švankmajer retrospective and the theme of resistance. These include:

- Jan Švankmajer: Dimensions of Dialogue / Between Film and Fine Art a life and career overview in text and images, organised by Czech Centres, with concept and text by Švankmajer's fellow members of the Group of Czech-Slovak Surrealists
- **Prague through the Lens of the Secret Police** Photos and text providing insight into the surveillance practices employed by the dreaded Czechoslovakian secret police.
- **Conspirators** (Melbourne only) an exhibition of sculptural works by local Australian artists, forming an international dialogue with the rich themes and irresistible tactility of Švankmajer's oeuvre.
